I. SITUATION UPDATE

Background

- ❖ Typhoon Nina (Hagupit) entered the Philippine Area of Responsibility as a Tropical Depression on September 19, 2008 at 10:00 AM. It intensified into a typhoon as it started moving away from the country. Typhoon Nina, although it did not make a landfall, enhanced the southwest monsoon and brought rains over southern Luzon and Visayas particularly over the western sections of the country. The surge of this southwest monsoon affected the seaboards of southern Luzon, Visayas and Mindanao. The enhanced southwest monsoon has triggered big waves, flooding and landslides in Regions I, II, III, IV-B, V, VI, X and CAR

II. EFFECTS

A. Affected Population

- ❖ Upon validation, the number of persons affected is **30,858 families / 127,031 persons**. **Affected areas are 480 Barangays in 50 Municipalities and 6 cities in 11 provinces** of Regions I, II, III, IV-B, V, VI, X and CAR
- ❖ **There are still 38 families / 185 persons staying in the five (5) designated evacuation centers in Regions IV-B and VI**

B. Casualties:

- ❖ **Dead** - 11 (CAR - 6, Region I - 2, Region VI - 2, Region VIII - 1)
- ❖ **Injured** - 23 (Region I - 1, CAR - 22)
- ❖ **Missing** - 17 (Region VI - 1, Region V - 5, CAR - 11)

C. Damaged Houses

- ❖ A total of **1,103** (170 totally; 933 partially) with Region I having the most number of damaged houses followed by Region CAR

D. Damage to Agriculture:

- ❖ The estimated cost of damage to properties increased from Php 183.395 Million to **Php220,230 Million**: Infrastructure (Php 219.330 Million) and Agriculture (Php 0.9 Million) with Region VI having the highest damage incurred in agriculture and CAR in infrastructure

E. Relief Assistance

- ❖ The cost of relief assistance provided by NDCC, DSWD, LGUs and NGOs is **Php1,018,649.00**

F. Status of Roads and Bridges as of 29 Sept 2008 (source DPWH)

Region II

- ❖ Tawi overflowbridge in Peñablanca, Cagayan is still not passable and has been underwater since September 22, 2008. However, Brgy. Tawi has an alternative road network in the western side going to and from neighboring barangays of Peñablanca and Tuguegarao City.

CAR

- ❖ The following roads with only one lane passable due to series of slides and road slips are the following: Manila North Road - Ilocos Norte 1st (Km 586 +500) Region I, and Mati-Maragusan Road (Km 1502+900) in Davao Oriental 2nd District, Region XI. Mobilized bulldozers and heavy equipment for clearing operations
- ❖ The following roads in CAR which are still closed to traffic are Claveria- Calanasan Road due to slides and washed-out at km 609+000 to 691+800 in Apayao; Balbalan Pinukpok Road (km 486+000-km 491+000) due to series of rock/soil slope collapsed and road slip in Kalinga; and Abra-Cervantes Road (Km 472+600) due to scoured abutment and sunken pier of Ba-ay Bridge in Abra. Installation of warning signs and clearing operations are ongoing
- ❖ The following roads which were previously reported closed are already opened to traffic: Bontoc-Baguio Road in Mt Province; Pico Lamtang Road, Acop-Kapangan-Kibungan-Bakun Road and Kabayan-Buguias-Abatan Road in Benguet; and Kalinga-Abra Road in Kalinga

III. NATIONAL RESPONSE

- ❖ NDCC facilitated the release of 200 sacks of rice to PDCC Benguet to augment relief operations
- ❖ DSWD activated its Quick Response and Social Welfare and Development teams in affected areas to assist the local government units in relief distribution, management of evacuation centers and released resource augmentation support worth P52,391.00 thru concerned LGUs: P29,846.00 food and other basic needs of stranded passengers in various ports and P39,192.00 worth of food and non-food items families affected in CAR and P15,324 in Bellison, Antique
- ❖ DPWH has mobilized bulldozers and equipment and pay loaders and conducted clearing operations in various road network affected by landslides which are still closed to traffic

IV. REGIONAL /LOCAL UPDATES/RESPONSE

Region IV-B

- ❖ Ipil Bridge (45.72 meters length washed-out/eroded concrete pavement and abutment approach “A” and “B”) and Pili Bridge (25 meters length washed-out bridge approach and collapsed abutment “B” with 21 meters tilted, eroded concrete pavement with scoured slope protection) in San Fernando, Romblon are still closed to traffic

Update of Restoration Works

- ❖ **Maintenance workforce augmented by heavy equipment are continuously working overtime to expedite early completion of emergency repair works on the damaged roads and bridges**
- ❖ Pili detour route along San Fernando-Magdiwang Road was already passable
- ❖ Preparation of detour road and construction of temporary Ipil Foot Bridge along Cajidiocan-San Fernando Road is in progress
- ❖ MDCC San Fernando together with the PNP personnel conducted relief operations in Brgy Panangcalan. DSWD IV-B provided relief assistance in three affected barangays in San Fernando, Romblon

Region VI

- ❖ DOH distributed medicines, food, water and Oresol to affected families in Barboza, Antique

CAR

- ❖ **OCD –CAR conducted small group meeting at OCD Opns Center to discuss matters concerning requirements at the landslide areas attended by Dr Antonio Bautista of DOH-HEMS, Engr Jorge Baywang of MGB-DENR as the Incident Commander and OCD Civil Defense Deputized Coordinator of Ifugao.**
- ❖ **Identified requirements that has been addressed**
 - **enhance communication system - OCD-CAR has provided radio sets and BB-PICAG provided landline/ mobile line ;**
 - **stick light - emergency purchase of stick light**
 - **Availability of blower 10K CFM 5HP or 10HP single phase, 220 volts to facilitate the recovery operations – SAR teams from Olongapo City and SBMA provided the needed equipment including 14 persons (7 from each team) with the following equipment : 2 blowers , portable pump(suction)’ ropes . generator(5Kwatts’ telescopic flood light, SCBA and all weather camera**
- ❖ **The on-scene commander briefed the SBMA teams yesterday on the situation upon arrival at the scene while the Olongapo 8-man team arrived yesterday morning with rescue van, blower and generator set.**

- ❖ **Navy SWAG coordinated with SWAG Cavite for additional team and diving gears. The team from Cavite arrived in Cordillera yesterday.**
- ❖ **PHILEX Mines Rescue Team piled sand bags to cover leaks and reduce water slippage at level 700. The progress of work of responders working with Self-Contained Breathing Apparatus (SCBA).**
- ❖ **Two (2) bodies were retrieved: Jojo Himayod of Nagtipunan Quirino retrieved on 25 Sept 5:30 PM and Vincent Himayod of Nagtipunan, Quirino on 26 Sept., 4:30 PM. Twelve (12) miners are still missing**
- ❖ **Three (3) trapped miners were rescued alive, Ngigit Pagulayan and Jose Panio Jr. was rescued by the Navy SWAG Team while Gerry Monyobda was rescued by the local miners last night. First aid treatment was provided to the victims and were later brought to Baguio General Hospital and Medical Center.**
- ❖ Benguet Mining Corporation and Philex Mining Corporation assisted in SAR operations
- ❖ PMA DRTG supported in the SAR / retrieval operations; PNP provided security; and Association of Private Miners assisted in SAR operations
- ❖ PNRC provided food and medicines; and DOH-CAR provided medicines, IV fluids, cadaver bags, masks and family food packs. They also provided technical assistance.

- ❖ **To divert the flow of water to Antamok River draining it to tailing pond**
