I. Background

- **The Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) affecting Visayas and Mindanao; the tail-end of a cold front affecting Northern and Central Luzon; and the strong winds associated with the surge of the northeast monsoon affecting the seaboard of Luzon triggered continuous heavy rains in Regions II, III, XI, CAR and CARAGA which caused flashflood/flooding in low-lying areas in said regions. Continuous heavy rains also caused the swelling/overflowing of the eastern tributaries of the Cagayan River**

II. Regional Updates

A. Population Affected (Details on Tab A)

- **As of 27 November 2008, a total of 69,681 families/331,032 persons were affected in 544 barangays of 35 municipalities and two (2) cities in the provinces of Cagayan and Isabela in Region II; Aurora in Region III; Kalinga in CAR and Davao del Norte in Region XI**
- **As per DepEd's report, there were 6,909 students affected in Cagayan, Isabela and Nueva Viscaya**

B. Status of Evacuees

- **Cumulative total served outside and inside evacuation centers were 22,310 families /92,081 persons: inside 32 evacuation center were -1,051 families/4,306 persons and outside evacuation centers were 21,259 families /87,775 persons. As of 27 November 2008, there are no more evacuees in the affected areas**

C. Casualties (Details on Tab B)

- **A total of 13 persons were reported dead: 7 in Cagayan and 4 in Isabela (Region II) and two (2) in Aurora (Region III) while four (4) persons are still missing: three (3) in Isabela (Region II) and one (1) in Aurora (Region III)**

D. Damages

- **Seventy one (75)** houses were damaged in Cagayan, Isabela and Aurora: **47 totally** and **28 partially** (Details on Tab C)
- The estimated cost of damage to agriculture and infrastructure in Regions II, III and CAR is **Php349.690M**: agriculture **Php156.560M** and infrastructure **Php193.230M** , broken down as follows:

E. Status of Major Roads, Bridges and other Structures (DPWH)

CAR

- Mt Province -Talubin–Barlig-Natonin-Calaccad Road (km426+500 Porag Section – passable as of 27 November 2008
- Kalinga – Mt Province-Calanan—Pinukpok-Abbut Road (punch thru)

Region II

- Cagayan III- Tuao–Orag Bridge Approach and Gagayan –Apayao Road- 1 lane passable to light vehicles due to scoured part of bridge approach
- Penablanca–Calao Cave Road (km 488-+065) Quibal, Penablanca – impassable due to road cut in both lanes. Alternate route is Penablanca Provincial Road
- Isabela Ist – Cabagan-Sta Maria Road (Cabagan –Sta Maria Overflow Bridge (Km-451-462) not passable to all types of vehicles due to flood Alternate route is Santiago-Tuquegarao Road

Region III

- All roads are passable as of November 27,2008

III. National /Regional Humanitarian Response

A. Cost of Assistance

- **The estimated cost of assistance provided by the national and local government amounted to Php5,768,455.00**

B. Cluster Response

Health and WASH

- HEMS–OPCEN augmented assorted medicines and medical supplies worth **Php125,212.00** while the CHD II distributed /delivered drugs and medical supplies, compact food and water disinfectants (waterine solutions) to the municipality of Tuao, Tuguegarao City and Isabela Province amounting to **Php76,183.00**

Food and Non-Food Items

- NDCC OPCEN facilitated the release of **1,850 sacks** of rice worth **Php1,688,125.00** to PDCCs Isabela and **Cagayan**; **CDCC** Tuguegarao, MDCCs **Amulung, Alcala, Aparri, Enrile and Cagayan and Ilagan, Isabela** to augment emergency relief operations being conducted by concerned DCCs/LGUs.
- **DSWD provided relief augmentation support / assistance to the affected LGUs of Cagayan, Isabela and Aurora amounting to P1,066,434.64**
- **Released additional standby funds worth P800,000.00 to DSWD-FOs II and III on November 25, 2008 for the purchase of supplies for emergency needs of affected families: Region III Php300,000.00 and Region II Php500,000.00**
- **Prepositioned P3.22 Million worth of relief resources readily available for release as augmentation support to affected LGUs whenever necessary.**

- **DSWD FO III has standby family food packs worth P300,000.00 ready for pick up to augment the requirement in the affected areas of Aurora**

Relief Operations

- OCD III coordinated with 7th ID, Fort Magsaysay for the availability of two (2) choppers to airlift relief goods from the Provincial Capitol of Aurora to the affected municipalities of Casiguran, Dinalungan and Dilasag
- **PDCC Aurora conducted relief operations in the affected municipalities with the assistance of two (2) choppers provided by 7th ID Fort Magsaysay, Bongabon, Nueva Ecija on November 24, 25 and 26, 2008**
- PDCC Kalinga and LGUs of the municipalities of Rizal and Lubuagan distributed relief goods to the affected families such as rice, noodles and sardines

Clearing Operations

- DPWH Engineering Districts mobilized five (5) units pay loader, 1 bulldozer and 1 dump truck to various road sections and bridges in the provinces of Aurora, Cagayan, Isabela and Kalinga which were reported closed to traffic due to floodwaters and series of landslides

Damage and Needs Assessment

- **OCDRCs concerned coordinated with LGUs thru the MSWDO for the conduct of assessment/validation of the affected families to determine appropriate social work interventions like food for work, livelihood assistance and etc**

Areas Declared

- PDCC Cagayan, CDCC Tuguegarao City, and MDCC Ilagan in Isabela declared their respective areas under a State of Calamity to utilize portion of their 5% local Calamity Fund

Search and Rescue Operations

- OCD II in coordination with contingents from PNP conducted field assessment in the flooded barangays of Amulung and Alcala, Cagayan and ocular survey in some evacuation centers in said municipalities; coordinated with PCG San Fernando and the Philippine Navy for possible rescue operations should flooding persist in the low-lying areas of Isabela and Cagayan.
- Elements from PNP, 17th IB of Philippine Army and PN conducted rescue and relief operations in flooded barangays of Pared and Baybayog in Alcala and Baculud, in Amulung all in Cagayan
- PDCCs of Cagayan and Isabela and affected MDCCs were jointly conducting SAR operations
