I. Situation Overview

- ❖ The tail-end of cold front affecting Bicol region and eastern sections of Visayas and Mindanao which prevailed from January 2-17, 2009 triggered the occurrence of continuous heavy rains with strong surge of northeast monsoon affecting the sea boards of northern and eastern Mindanao triggering big waves
- ❖ Likewise, the concentration of large volumes of water in the uplands of Pigkutin River in Talakag, Bukidnon flowed into the Cagayan de Oro River which caused the accumulation of water in the uplands of Iligan City, Oroquieta City, Gingoog City and Misamis Oriental. The high tides at early dawn for at least one week prevented Cagayan de Oro River's normal flow towards Macajalar Bay in Misamis Oriental.
- ❖ These resulted into **37 incidents** on flashfloods/ floodings, landslides high tide/big/strong waves, storm surge and sea mishaps in Regions I, IV-B, V, VI, VII, VIII, IX, X, XI, ARMM and CARAGA.

 - Inside evacuation centers - 19,013/90,757 persons
 - Outside evacuation centers - 87,429 families /426,984 persons

- ❖ The estimated cost of assistance provided by NDCC, DSWD, DOH, LGUs, other GOs and NGOs in all areas affected is PhP26,476,208.66, broken down as follows:

B. National Response

- ❖ PGMA presided the cabinet meeting at Macaraeg Ancestral House in Timogan, Iligan City, Lanao del Norte on January 6, 2009 and joint RDCC meeting (X and CARAGA) at Camiguin Highland Resort, Mambajao on Jan 7, 2009

- ❖ **The President also presided a joint PDCC Misamis Oriental – CDCC Cagayan de Oro meeting with selected RDCC member agencies attended at Upper Carmen, Cagayan de Oro on January 21, 2009**
- ❖ The President distributed 1,500 food packs to the evacuees in Brgys Carmen and Macasandig in Cagayan de Oro City with PAGCOR's medical mission
- ❖ The SND as Chairman, NDCC visited Cagayan de Oro City on 15 January 2009 and conferred with Mayor Jaraula of Cagayan de Oro City the current situation in the city. The SND met PDCC Chairman/Governor Oscar Moreno after which followed the short informal press conference

OCD-NDCC

- ❖ Facilitated the availability of PAF Aircraft (UHIH) on January 8, 2009 utilized by Deputy Administrator, OCD from TOG 5 Legaspi to Catanduanes; **the release of 3,250 sacks of rice (Php2,965,562.00) to various LGUs affected by flood, landslides and big waves;** and the airlift of DOH-HEMS' assorted medicines and medical kits (30 cartons) via Pokker Plane on 15 January 2009 and 647 packages of DSWD's relief goods (11,476 kilos /25,248 lbs) via C-130 PAF-Plane on 16 January 2009 to Cagayan de Oro City, Region X

DSWD

- ❖ Deployed its Field Offices Social Welfare and Development teams to undertake data generation, relief distribution and management of evacuation centers in coordination with the local government units (LGUs), other government offices (GOs) and non government offices (NGOs); and mobilized a seven man team from DSWD-Field Office XI to assist the DSWD X in the disaster operations
- ❖ Provided the emergency relief needs of the affected families in the amount of Php6,099,534.41 distributed as follows:

- ❖ Airlifted assorted emergency relief commodities (noodles, blankets, clothing packs, bedsheets, plastic mats, others) to Cagayan de Oro City on board a C-130 PAF-AFP aircraft on 16-17 January amounting to Php900,084.00
- ❖ Released Php5.1 Million to DSWD FOs VIII and X as additional standby funds for the purchase of emergency relief supplies: DSWD X-Php4.3 million and DSWD VIII-Php800,000.00
- ❖ Allocated Php995,550.00 worth of assorted relief commodities to Cagayan de Oro City and pre positioned Php6.92 M worth of standby funds and relief commodities (family food packs, canned goods and clothing) readily available for release to affected families in Regions X, XI and CARAGA
- ❖ Prepositioned Php9.2Million worth of stand by funds and relief commodities (family food packs, canned goods, clothing packs, etc) readily available for release to affected families broken down as follows:

- ❖ Augmented assorted drugs, medicines and supplies worth PhP212,346.23 and cash allocation (QRF) to Cagayan de Oro, Region X amounting to PhP1,000,000.00
- ❖ **HEMS-OPCEN provided drinking water disinfectant, anti-infective/fungal ointment and water containers for drinking in DOH- CARAGA worth PhP220,181.40**

C. Regional Cluster Responses

1. Food and Non-Food Items

Region I

- ❖ Affected families in Aringay, La Union were provided with the following relief supplies: DSWD I 90 family food packs; ABS-CBN Sagip Kapamilya assorted relief; Congressman Dumpit 3 sacks NFA rice, 2 boxes noodles and 4 boxes coffee; PNRC I 93 packs assorted goods and 2 cartons used clothing; MDCC Aringay 248 packs relief goods (1kilo rice, 1 coffee (25 grms), ½ kilo sugar and 2 packs noodles; PDCC La Union 90 packs relief goods (3 kilos rice, 3 noodles, 3 sardines and 1 coffee (50 gms) and 1 coffee mate) per pack

Region V

- ❖ PDCC Catanduanes and DSWD5 SWAD team distributed relief assistance in the municipalities of Bagamanoc, Baras, San Miguel and Viga in the form of noodles, rice and canned goods amounting to PhP432,000.00. The affected municipalities initially provided local assistance to their respective constituents after the Province of Catanduanes had been declared under a State of Calamity. DSWD 5 augmented 100 bags of rice and assorted canned goods (pork and beans, sausages and sardines) and 50 pcs T-Shirts to PDCC Catanduanes

Region VI

- ❖ PDCC Capiz provided food assistance in the affected barangays of Sigma, Capiz

Region VII

- ❖ MDCC Amlan, Negros Oriental, MDCC Ginatilan, Cebu, PNRC Negros Oriental Chapter and other civic organizations provided food assistance and other needs of evacuees who stayed with relatives

Region VIII

- ❖ The PDMO of Northern Samar provided relief assistance in the Municipality of Lavesares; DSWD 8 allocated 1,000 family packs; and LGU Lavesares released relief goods amounting to PhP46,800.00
- ❖ OCD 8 coordinated with DSWD 8 for possible augmentation of food assistance to the affected barangays in Guiuan, Eastern Samar
- ❖ TOG 8-PAF dispatched two (2) helicopters and motorized bancas to deliver food assistance to Homonhon and Suluan Islands, Guiauan, Eastern Samar to address the need for food in the area in view of the lack of supply because there is no regular transportation available due to bad weather

Region IX

- ❖ MDCC Lebason, MDCC Katipunan and Alliance Church provided food and clothing as well as distributed construction materials to the affected families

Region X

- ❖ PDCC Misamis Oriental provided food assistance distributed as follows: Opol (7 sacks rice, 2 boxes sardines and 2 boxes noodles); El Salvador (7 sacks rice, 2 boxes sardines and 2 boxes noodles); Alubijid (7 sacks rice, 2 boxes sardines and noodles); and COC Evacuation Center (2 sacks rice, 1 box sardines and noodle)
- ❖ CDCC Cagayan de Oro provided immediate food assistance in Brgy Caman-manan (3 sacks of rice, 2 boxes sardines and 2 boxes noodles)

Region XI

- ❖ MDCC Cateel, Davao Oriental provided relief goods to the affected families
- ❖ LGU Kapalong, provided 2 sacks of rice, 1 box sardines and 1 box noodles to the 58 families;
- ❖ LGU Asuncion served the 2,185 households with 138 sacks rice, 81 boxes noodles 44 boxes sardines and assorted medicines;
- ❖ CDCC Tagum City provided the 474 families with 49 sacks rice, 22 boxes noodles, 15 boxes sardines and assorted medicines; and

- ❖ MDCC Carmen provided 50 sacks of rice, 23 boxes noodles and 16 boxes sardines to the affected barangays in Maco, Davao del Norte

Region XII

- ❖ **OCD XII coordinated with food cluster in the region for possible food assistance of 200 families affected in President Roxas, North Cotabato**

CARAGA

- ❖ NFA Regional Office released 1,693 bags of rice for relief operations in Surigao del Norte and Sur and Agusan del Norte on credit lines under MOA with LGUs
- ❖ Respective LGUs provided the following assistance:
 - Prosperidad - 18 sacks rice, 600 tons sardines and 900 packs noodles to its constituents
 - Rosario - 18 sacks rice, 690 tins sardines, 690 packs noodles and 230 tins corned beef
 - Bunawan - PhP67,296.00 cash for fuel, medicines and food; PhP360,000.00 cash from PDCC Agusan del Sur for medicines and food assistance; and PhP100,000.00 from Philsaga Mining Corporation for food assistance
- ❖ MDCC Bunawan, Agusan del Sur Relief, Medical and Rehabilitation Team conducted relief operations in Brgy San Marcelino, Bunawan

ARMM

- ❖ The Office of the Provincial Governor initially provided 629 food packs and instructed the SACC to prepare any assistance to complement the efforts of the municipalities affected.
- ❖ PDCC Sulu conducted relief operations in Bus-Bus and Jolo Area Coordinating Center and in Patikul area
- ❖ The relief distribution in Pangutaran is tentatively scheduled on 24 January 2009 if the weather permits,
- ❖ Donors/Sources of relief goods were the Sulu Provincial Government /Office of the Provincial Governor; DSWD CO; Office of the Municipal Mayors, Mindanao Emergency Response Network and Jolo Emergency Network Inc; IPHO and MAM
- ❖ Regional Secretary Bai Soraida Beruar of DSWD-ARMM pledged to release PhP200,000.00 fund for PSWDO –Sulu
- ❖ PDCC Sulu released the 200 sacks rice provided by the NDCC; served cooked food and provided food packs and non-food items to the affected families in Jolo
- ❖ MDCC Pangutaran also provided food items (rice, sardines, noodles, sugar and coffee) to the affected families
- ❖ Mayor Amin of Jolo provided PhP10,000.00 cash for the repair of damaged footbridge in Port area Brgy Walled City
- ❖ NDCC released 500 sacks of rice to PDCC Lanao del Sur through DSWD ARMM
- ❖ ARMM Regional Vice Governor and DILG-ARMM Regional Secretary Ansaruddin Adiong, Lanao del Sur Governor Mamintal Adiong, local DSWD and LDCCs concerned provided immediate relief assistance to the flash-flood –stricken areas in Sulu
- ❖ Based on the request of 1st District Congresswoman Faysah RPM Dumapa, RDCC – ARMM recommended to NDCC, the release of 100 sacks of rice assistance to augment existing resources of affected LGUs in Lanao del Sur

1. Health Cluster

Region VIII

- ❖ CHD VIII conducted immunization, health education and consultation at the evacuation centers in Palapag, Catarman and Laverares, Northern Samar; provided drugs and medicines to PDCC Northern Samar through Gov Raul Daza and MDCCs through mayors/MHOs; provided technical assistance to affected LGUs; and augmented health manpower at Lavesares and Catarman Rural Health Units
- ❖ RHU Catarman conducted site visitation and rapid health assessment, consultation and health education; measles immunization (26 children vaccinated 9 mos-4 yrs old); vitamin A supplementation (67 children 9 mos-5 yrs old); and daily disease surveillance in five (5) evacuation centers in Catarman
- ❖ The MHU Lavesares conducted health activities in Lavesares Central Elementary School such as: disease surveillance (ARI, fever and diarrhea); immunization of 7 children

(measles vaccination of 9 mo-5yrs old); water sanitation (3 flush toilets and level 2 water source); medical services by MHO; and psychosocial care (CISD) by MSWD to the parents of dead victims

- ❖ **CHD VIII augmented assorted medicines worth PhP100,000.00**

Region X

- ❖ CHD X continue augmenting medicines and supplies, measles vaccines and vitamin A and providing technical assistance in the formulation of Health Emergency Preparedness Response, Recovery Plan (HEPRRP)
- ❖ LGU Alubijid, Misamis Oriental conducted joint medical mission with PGMA in the municipality of Balingasag, Misamis Oriental
- ❖ CHD X provided logistical support to the LGUs in the region in the form of medicines, drugs, medical supplies measles vaccine, vitamin A, water containers, sodium hypochlorite solution, tetanus toxoids, syringe and miscellaneous expenses in the amount of PhP654,686.00; allocated cash assistance in the amount of PhP1M; **provided technical support to the LGUs in terms of disaster management ; and continue conducting disease surveillance in evacuation centers. The top 5 morbidity in evacuation centers are acute respiratory illness (50%), Fever (20%), gastritis (15%), wounds (10%) and diarrhea (5%)**

CARAGA

- ❖ CHD CARAGA prepositioned drugs/fluids and medicines in all Provincial Health Team (PHT) Office. Augmented chlorine granules oresol and assorted drugs worth **PhP51,355.50**.
- ❖ CHD team conducted disease surveillance on 15 January 2009 and **the leading cause of consultation in the evacuation centers were fever, acute respiratory tract Infections, abdominal pain, diarrhea and skin rashes**
- ❖ **CHD-CARAGA dispatched CHD response teams to the Municipalities of Veruela and Rosario in Agusan del Sur and Jabonga in Agusan del Norte**

2. Shelter Assistance

CARAGA

- ❖ Surigao City allocated PhP6,175.00 worth of light materials for totally destroyed houses in Brgys San Juan, Lipata and Washington

4. SAR and Clearing Operations

Region VI

- ❖ The Provincial Engineering Office of Capiz conducted clearing operations at the landslide areas

Region VIII

- ❖ OCD 8 in coordination with TOG 8 PAF General Command and ABS-CBN Tacloban, conducted aerial SAR for the 7 missing persons on board MB Rogen through the use of Nomad plane. The team sighted a floating boat full of water near the Manicani Island but due to poor visibility, it was not verified if it was MB Rogen. The team decided to go back to the station.
- ❖ Coordinated with PN and PCG Tacloban Stations for the conduct of SAR operations with the use of naval sea vessel and provided them with the coordinates of the location of motorized banca sighted by the team. As of reporting time, the 7 persons are still missing

Region IX

- MDCC Lebason conducted clearing operations in the affected areas and requested for funding support from PDCC Zambaonga del Norte

Region X

- ❖ PCG Northern Mindanao District dispatched 4 rubber boats and 2 patrol boats to conduct SAR operations. PDCC Misamis Oriental dispatched 1 back hoe to conduct immediate clearing operations at Barangay Taparak, Alubijid in said province. The Philippine Army dispatched three (3) 6x6 trucks to transport evacuees in Alubijid and El Salvador. Other responders which provided manpower and rescue equipment to support the SAR

operations were TOG 10 PAF, RCDG 10, PRO-PNP, 4ID PA, PNRC, DOH and Iligan Rescue 811

- ❖ Misamis Oriental Provincial District Engineer's Office conducted clearing operations at landslide areas along the Highway in Gingoog Section utilizing LGU Gingoog City's equipment
- ❖ PNRC Misamis Oriental and Cagayan de Oro Chapter conducted rescue operations in Brgy Balua, Cagayan de Oro City

Region XI

- ❖ Concerned PDCCs and MDCCs conducted emergency meetings for possible declaration of areas under a State of Calamity. MDCCs Maco and Maragusan Davao del Norte established their respective Incident Command System (ICS). Municipal Engineering Office and PDCC Compostela Valley conducted clearing operations at the landslide area

CARAGA

- ❖ PDCC Agusan del Sur dispatched SAR team with rubber boat, stake truck and Isuzu elf vehicle to the affected areas and MDCC Carmen, Agusan del Norte conducted immediate declogging of canals in Brgy Poblacion

ARMM

- ❖ On 14 January 2009, the PDCC/ACC, DSWD, JERN Inc, D'ALERT, JIDF, BFP, LGU Jolo and RPMA jointly facilitated the transport of victims from the affected barangays to Jolo ACC, Sulu. D'ALERT Lupah Sug; Jolo Emergency Rescue Network Inc; 55th ECB, Philippine Army; DSWD and IPHO Sulu; PNP; AFP; and Suara-AI Hidaya, Suara Lupah Sug provided support in the SAR operations

5. Livelihood

- ❖ **DA X coordinated with LGUs concerned on the conduct of initial validation, distribution of vegetable seeds in affected areas and nearby riverbanks, emergency procurement of registered corn and rice seeds for replacement**

6. Other Activities

Region X

- ❖ RDCC team of MGB-DENR, CDO-DILG, CDO-CENRO, OCD X and 10th TOG conducted aerial survey in the flooded areas in Cagayan de Oro City
- ❖ Kabalikat Civicom established communication Center at OCD-X Regional Office and assisted PCG operatives
- ❖ DPWH dispatched dump trucks for use of rescuers/flood victims; conducted immediate repair of Opol concrete bridge in Misamis Oriental
- ❖ **Xavier University Ateneo de Cagayan Engineering Resource Center provided a damage impact map of Cagayan de Oro City showing relative intensity of people in each of the barangays**

Region XII

- ❖ **PDCC XII and MDCC Pres Roxas have been conducting damage and needs assessment in President Roxas**
- ❖ **DPWH conducted immediate repair of reported damaged dikes and roads**

**EMERGENCY INCIDENTS MONITORED IN VARIOUS REGIONS:
AFTER-EFFECTS OF TAIL-END OF COLD FRONT
AS OF JANUARY 28, 2009**

Region I

- ❖ January 10, 2009 - high tide associated with big waves occurred in Brgy Berlin-Alaska in Aringay, La Union

Region VI

- ❖ January 5-6, 2009 – flooding occurred in Capiz affecting 62 barangays namely: Pontevedra (6); Panitan (17); Sigma (16); Dao (13); and Cuartero (10)
- ❖ January 5, 2009 – landslidesh occurred in Brgys Nagba, Mainit and San Antonio in Cuartero, and Brgy Sta Rita in Dumalag all in Capiz
- ❖ January 12, 2009 -sea mishap involving a motorized banca capsized in Tinagong Dagat Sea, Barangay Bantigue, Panay

Region VII

- ❖ January 12, 2009 -strong/big waves hit Brgys Mag-Abo and Jugno in Amlan, Negros Oriental
- ❖ January 13, 2009 - another big waves hit five (5) coastal barangays of Ginatilan, Cebu

Region VIII

- ❖ January 10, 2009- widespread flooding occurred in Bobon, Catarman, Lavesares and San Roque, Northern Samar with the following road sections damaged :
 - Palapag-Mapanas section (Brgys Nipa-Maragana-Ginpandayan section) hardly passable due to washed-out surfacing materials
 - Brgy Magta-on-Brgy Mambot section and Mapanas-Gamay Road (Brgys Lipatan-San Antonio-Libertad Poblacion Gamay) hardly passable to traffic due to settlement of roadway
- ❖ January 10, 2009 – landslide occurred in Brgy. Ocad, Lavesares, Northern Samar
- ❖ January 10, 2009 -sea mishap (involving a motorized banca identified as “Rogin” was reported missing in Suluan Island, Guiuan, Eastern Samar with 7 persons reported missing

Region IX

- ❖ January 14, 2009 - the municipalities of Lebason, Katipunan and Zamboanga Peninsula were affected by storm surge and strong waves due to northeast monsoon with 14 houses damaged: 10 partially and 4 totally

Region X

- ❖ January 3, 2009 - high tide intensified flooding in the coastal barangays of Cagayan de Oro and 2 barangays of Gingoog City, Misamis Oriental
