I. Situation Overview & highlights

Jaffna District:

- The A9 road from the Jaffna Peninsula was opened for public and private vehicles from 18 December, with movement permitted between 6.00am and 4.00pm. Travel no longer requires authorization. However, the transport of goods will continue to take place through vehicle convoys and standard registration processes. The UN is consulting with the relevant government authorities to clarify use of the A9 road for UN/INGO vehicles.
- On 27 December, the Governor of the Northern Province Major General G. A. Chandrasiri met UN/INGO representatives as a follow-up to previous meetings. Minister for Social Services and Social Welfare Douglas Devananda was also present. The Governor discussed UN/INGO support to resettled/released families in Jaffna and requested additional support for immediate assistance, such as transportation, shelter and WASH. The Governor also requested support for livelihood projects (fishing nets, agriculture inputs). During the meeting, he reviewed and approved for implementation all projects submitted by agencies during the last District Review Board meeting on 18 December. All projects were approved for implementation and agencies requested to start immediately.
- The Minister of Social Services and Social Welfare Douglas Devananda announced that of 30 December the curfew in Jaffna District will be lifted.

Kilinochchi District:

- On 23 December, the office of the Government Agent (GA) for Kilinochchi District started functioning out of its previous premises in Kilinochchi town. Administrative functions for Kilinochchi were carried out from Vavuniya during the conflict.

Trincomalee District:

- The Governor of the Eastern Province, Rear Admiral Wijewickrema announced that as of 1 January, the remaining fishing restrictions in the seas off the Eastern coast would be lifted to allow for 24 hours of fishing, although excluding the High Security Zones in the Trincomalee Harbor. The announcement was made at a meeting with representatives of the fishing community at the naval office in Trincomalee. Admiral Wijewickrema added that only suspicious fishing craft would be subjected to security checks. The fishing permit system will also be abolished but fishermen were advised to keep permits already issued as proof of identity if required.

Vavuniya District:

- An increase in dengue cases was first noted in the Vavuniya Medical Officer of Health (MOH) area in early September. Up to 25 December, 860 cases were reported. The MOH has taken appropriate action to address this situation. Firstly, massive clean-up campaigns have been conducted in Menik Farm and elsewhere in Vavuniya District, such as in areas surrounding the hospitals, to decrease the density of the dengue vector. These campaigns have been coupled with regular health education sessions within the communities by volunteers and health workers. The public is encouraged to seek early treatment. Secondly, the clinical management of dengue patients is also being improved by providing refresher courses to doctors and nurses.
- Incidences of other priority diseases under surveillance in Menik Farm have declined. Between 19 and 25 December, a total of 161 diarrhoea cases, 12 chickenpox cases, two dysentery cases and one typhoid case were reported.

II. Sector Overview & highlights

SHELTER / NFI

Vavuniya District:

- Approximately 6,000 Menik Farm tents have been covered with polythene. Most of the remaining 3,600 tents, including those in the government-administered zones, are leaking. Agencies have stepped up maintenance, while work continues to place the polythene covers on the balance tents.
- On Site 6A, returning IDPs have begun to take down not just their own shelters, but other unoccupied shelters, for use in the return areas. This situation has created transportation issues during the return movements and problems keeping track of the shelters requiring maintenance or decommissioning. Agencies are now decommissioning vacated shelters as soon as possible.
- In Zone 3, 48 shelters were decommissioned leaving 477 shelters on the site.
- In Zone 3, around 650 tents have been decommissioned leaving 5,569 still on the site.
- Three agencies are handling the maintenance of approximately 200 shelters in all zones.
- In Zone 2, the Disaster Management Centre (DMC) is installing safety fences along deep road drains, with funding support from the Shelter sector.

Jaffna District:

- Shelter agencies carried out emergency repairs and provided repair material for shelters at the Ramavil and PRI camps damaged by the recent heavy rains. Additional tarpaulins were also distributed.
- Agencies are awaiting final approval of shelter projects for the recent returnee families. Verbal approval was given by the Governor of the Northern Province Major General G. A. Chandrasiri during a 27 December meeting and by the District Review Board.
- Shelter grants are being issued. More than 15,000 returnee families have received the grant so far.
- Over 20,000 families have received the return kit that includes NFIs, tools, tarpaulins and a hygiene kit.

WASH

Jaffna District:

- A Technical Working Group continues to plan and define standards for WASH interventions in the return areas. An initial design for septic tank and toilets was drafted. Agencies have also agreed that repairs to WASH facilities should be limited to less than 1/3 of the cost of the facility; the facility will be replaced in case of repairs in excess of the agreed limit. Furthermore, the Participatory Hygiene and Sanitation Transformation (PHAST) technique will be used for hygiene promotion among returnees and a Training of Trainers workshop will be held in January 2010.

Trincomalee District:

- Around 80% of WASH facilities in the Pulmoddai camp's Plot 1 have been decommissioned. In Plot 2, all the WASH facilities were decommissioned and garbage collection is in progress.
- The Muttur and Eachchilampattai Divisional Secretaries have agreed to support WASH activities proposed for returnee communities. The District Secretaries will brief village Grama Niladari (GN) and Rural Development Society officers to develop criteria for selection of beneficiaries, decide on the selection process and identify locations for common WASH facilities.

HEALTH & NUTRITION

Jaffna District:

- Agencies supported the Regional Director of Health Services (RDHS) office to hold refresher workshops on the Nutrition Rehabilitation Programme (NRP) for Public Health Midwives (PHM) from Kayts.
- Supplementary and therapeutic feeding programmes are continuing for IDPs in camps and resettled communities.

Trincomalee District:

- Agencies supported the RDHS office to conduct several training, advocacy and counselling programmes aimed at improving maternal and child nutrition. The RDHS in collaboration with Health

Sector partners conducts regular reviews, such as on maternal mortality, to improve public health indicators in Trincomalee District.

Vavuniya District:

- 45 cases of mumps were until the 25 December 2009 and about 66 percent of the cases were from Zones 5 and 6. Patients are being treated in Poovarasankulam Hospital, Cheddikulam Base Hospital, Vavuniya General Hospital and the MSF Hospital.

PROTECTION

Vavuniya District:

- Authorities continue to promote and organise IDP returns to the Vanni areas. In addition to several convoys from Menik Farm, the first two returns from host families took place at the end of December. The Protection Sector was unable to monitor these movements as planned due to unexpected changes to the schedule. Protection Working Group actors have been invited – where possible – to conduct some monitoring on the place of departure to better understand the conditions with host families, the information provided to IDPs on the return process and their expectations/ anticipated challenges in the areas of return. Authorities delayed some convoys due to weather conditions and advocacy on the need to avoid return to mine-hazardous areas or areas that have not been properly assessed (e.g., Vavuniya North). Convoys have been organised to Poonakary (Kilinochchi District), Thunukkai, Oddusuddan (in Mullaitivu District) and Karachchi (Kilinochchi District). The next convoys are expected to depart starting 4 January 2010 to Oddusuddan, Manthai East (Mullaitivu District), Poonakary and Pallai (Kilinochchi District).
- Group discussions with returnees in Killinochchi, Karachchi and Thunukkai reveal that people generally wish to go back home but harbour concerns about prevailing conditions. While livelihood resumption is a major concern, issues pertaining to personal safety continue to be raised, in connection to the heavy military presence and unconfirmed reports of armed groups in certain locations. Reportedly, in remote rural locations, authorities recommend night precautionary measures (e.g., securing houses and limited movement). Single women returning with their dependants may face additional constraints in rehabilitating shelters or daily activities, such as fetching water and yard cleaning, if not properly supported by community mechanisms. In some areas, movement remains restricted after return, largely due to mine clearance. Family separation remains of concern for departing IDPs, especially when spouses, dependants or relatives remain behind in rehabilitation/surrender centres in Vavuniya. Transportation facilities and related costs remain too high for some families or are still not in place in remote areas of return.
- Although generally functioning, the pass system remains unevenly applied across the zones. In some cases, this is because the authorities consider some zones as transit/pre-departure areas. In other cases, the regime seems to be simply left to the discretion of the respective Zone Commander. At present, IDPs in the Zone 5 transit area are allowed to exit the camp for a day only. In Zones 1, 3 and 4, a more open regime is reportedly in place, with IDPs granted permission to leave Menik Farm for up to one month. Zone 0 has a 7-day permit. IDPs and authorities in the zones consulted did not report any obligation to leave family members behind, although this is often the preferred choice of families to keep abreast of return plans and convoys. IDPs are allowed entry or exit via the pass system between 7:00a.m. and 6:00p.m. The incidence of IDPs not returning after the pass/travel permit expires seems to vary across zones. Restrictions on direct access between zones continue.
- As of 28 December, there were 2,339 individuals (664 families) in Zone 5. This excludes the 856 individuals (346 families) from the Pulmoddai camp in Trincomalee District. They arrived in two main moves at the end of November-beginning of December and continue to be hosted in blocks 3 and 5. These sections of Zone 5 are considered a Collection Centre/Transit Zone for people awaiting departure or relocation to other areas of Menik Farm. Part of this group has been able to join convoys to accessible areas in Killinochchi and Karachchi. Few families consider their departure imminent, having been held back due to the ongoing school examinations. A group of families also originate from Killinochchi villages, which are not yet cleared by the demining process. Their future departure date remains unspecified, while the level of assistance received in the Transit Site is lower than in other zones. While the consulted IDPs are extremely willing to go back to their areas of origin as soon as possible, they regret having left Pulmoddai to end up in a prolonged limbo in Menik Farm. Some of them have received information from community members, who have reached their areas of return. However, information/knowledge of return areas remains scanty among IDPs. Livelihood and access to services are often the main concerns, as well as mines/UXO dangers. They request more information about potential contamination in their specific villages (Mine Risk Education (MRE) was

received in the East before departure).

- On 23 December, the helpline to trace missing children and child abuse reporting was inaugurated on 23 December. The helpline is managed in the Government Agent's office by a pool of dedicated Probation Office staff. During its first week, 120 calls concerning missing children and 94 on missing adults have been received (Source: UNICEF). One successful tracing was ensured (missing children in a rehabilitation centre). The availability of a broader range of population records (e.g., in area of displacement and in areas of return) for the Probation Officers in charge for facilitating the tracing process remains an important issue.
- The Gender based Violence Working Group continues to advocate for a prompt re-establishment of government institutions and services in return areas in the Vanni. At present, this is not keeping speed with the accelerated pace of population return, or – where re-established – government institutions are temporarily diverted to more return-related administrative tasks. A risk of disruption of services support (medical, psychosocial, legal) in the return areas should be avoided. The Working Group continues consultations for the final approval of a Standard Operating Procedure on case-referrals and has updated a service map to be used as a reference for all partners involved in case-referrals.
- Based on consultation with IDPs in various zones of Menik Farm, it is reported that IDPs can register to vote if in possession of either National Identity Cards or the temporary/"presidential" identity cards issued during the displacement in Menik Farm. The possession of a valid identification documents remains a prerequisite to voter registration.

EDUCATION

Vavuniya District:

- Hygiene and sanitation conditions of surrendee camps sharing premises with schools represent a serious hazard, given the present outbreak of dengue.

LIVELIHOOD/EARLY RECOVERY

Vavuniya District:

- Joint Assessments were carried out in the Phase I resettlement villages of Paranaddakal, Nochchimoddai, Nampankulam, Omanthai, Vepankulam and Arasamuripu. On 29 December a joint assessment was completed in Rangethagama in the Vavuniya South Divisional Secretariat (DS) Division.

LOGISTICS

- The 2 Mobile Storage Units (MSUs) at the Kilinochchi Inter Agency Logistics base have now been erected. Once the still wet compacted gravel has dried out sufficiently, it will be possible to provide additional storage capacity for food and other relief materials that are currently relying on the four twenty-foot containers in the compound.
- The dismantling of the Trincomalee base was completed on 25 December, with the MSUs being relocated to Vavuniya in preparation for re-assembly in the Vanni region as and when the need arises for additional Extended Delivery Point storage facilities.
- Six small trucks and eight tractors with trailers have been sourced by the WFP Special Operation. These will be operated by the District Multi-Purpose Cooperative Societies (MPCS) to facilitate delivery of small quantities of relief assistance to resettled communities that are difficult to re-supply inside the Vanni with the UN fleet vehicles or more regular transport options.
- Storage containers have been moved to various locations (Manthai West, Manthai North, Poonakary) to support distributions.

As this work is taking place in the middle of the rainy season, the beneficiaries involved in the unskilled work were finding difficulties in the pit excavation and pit construction due to the shallow water table. The rainy season also became a hindrance for the construction works, well cleaning, well renovation, travel and transportation of material to the sites, which finally affected the progress of the work. In light of these challenges, the current project focus is on achieving any feasible progress in support of the resettlement of the IDPs. During this reporting period, the assessments in Mankumpan and Mandaitivu islands were completed and the following progress has been made since the work started Out of 65 new toilets planned, 9 have been completed, and work on the rest is in progress. Out of 50 toilets planned for rehabilitation, 5 have been completed, the rest are in progress. Out of 50 wells planned for cleaning, 39 have been completed and the rest are in progress. Out of 50 well renovations planned, 3 have been completed and the rest are in progress.
		Jaffna	UNICEF continues to decommission WASH facilities that were provided in the IDP camps and Schools (TLSs) that have now been vacated, as well as rehabilitating those that are damaged in the existing camps. Priority has been given for all decommissioning activity in the schools. During this reporting period decommissioning activity in the Mirusuvil and Kodikammam TLS have been completed and works are in progress in 2 schools that were former IDP camps (Kodikammam and Mirusuvil) with the support of local authorities. WASH facilities in both schools will be in working shape before the resumption of the school year on 4 th Jan 2010.
			UNICEF is supporting the Jaffna ZDE in improving water and sanitation facilities in 20 schools affected by the conflict. 3200 students, children who are long term IDPs from conflict and war, are directly benefiting from this project. During this reporting period, the construction of sanitation units was completed in 3 schools, bringing the total of completed schools to 17 out of the 20 that are planned. Work is ongoing on the remaining 6 schools, where all work is expected to be completed by the 1 st week of Jan 2010.
