

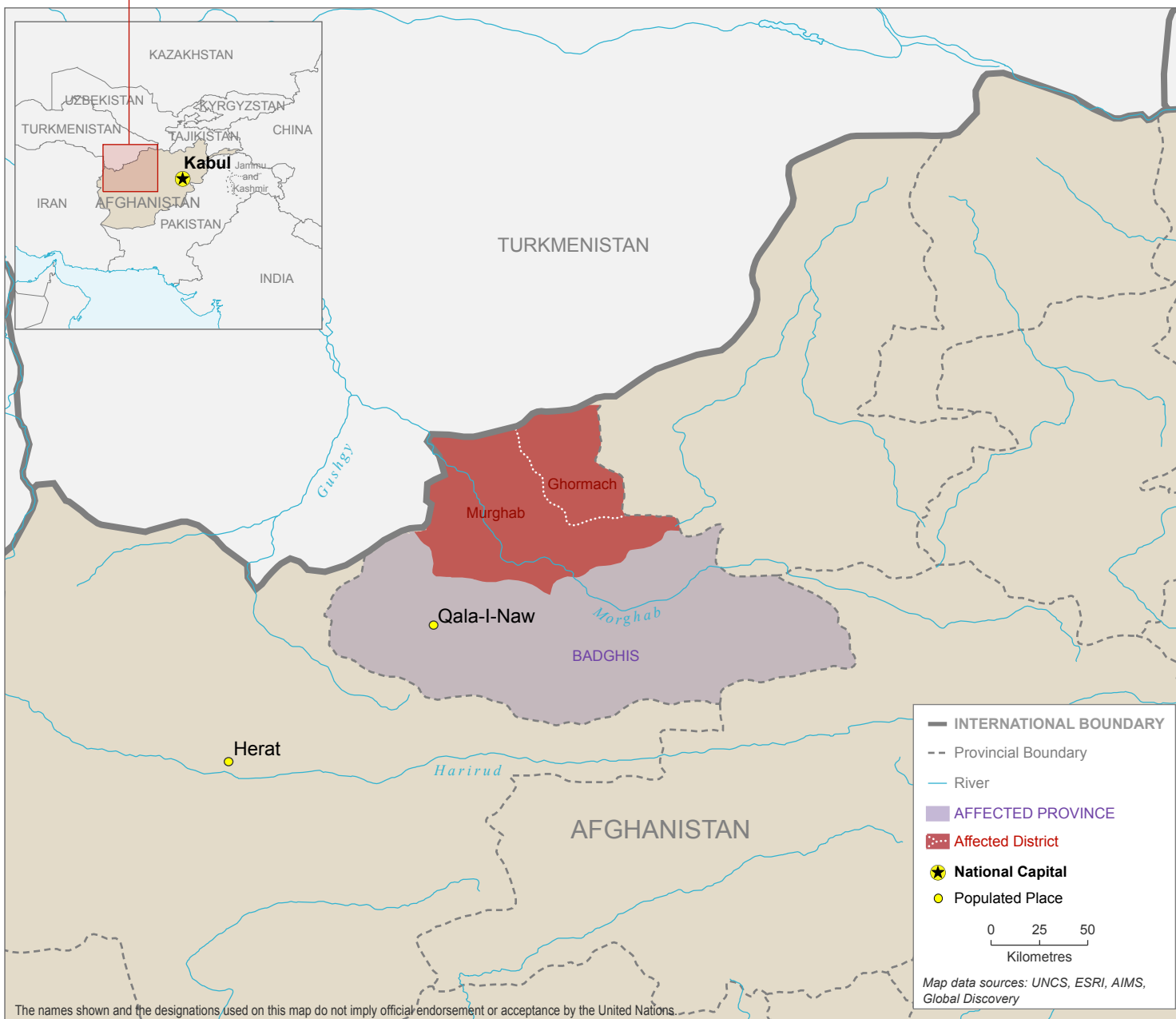
Afghanistan: Floods - situation map no. 2

Torrential rains in Western Afghanistan caused flash floods and the death of 66 people leaving more than 100 missing. 3,515 families have been affected, with significant loss of livestock.

SITUATION

- Floods triggered during night on Thursday, November 16th in Province of Badghis
- Most severely affected districts: Murghab and Ghormach
- Response on a national, regional and provincial level

ACTION

- UN response coordinated from Herat where emergency stocks pre-positioned
- These stocks taken by road to Qala-I-Naw
- WFP, UNHCR, UNICEF and Spanish Provincial Reconstruction Team distributed relief supplies
- Afghan Ministry of Public Health along with ARCS and WHO dispatched medical team affected area with 1 MT of medical supplies
- UNAMA Humanitarian Unit and Field Offices continues to monitor situation and assist Afghan Government in emergency response effort
