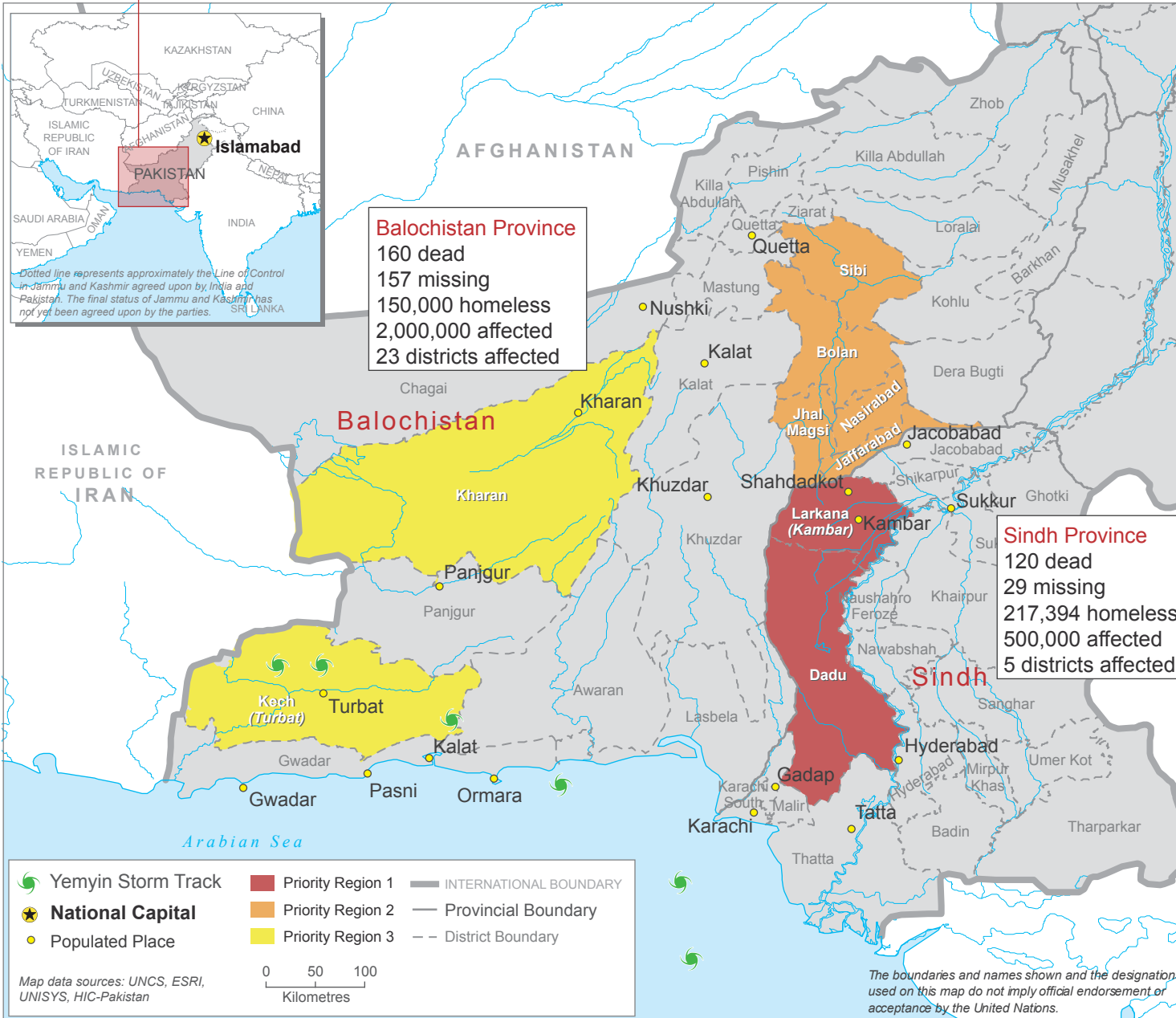


Pakistan: Floods/Cyclone (as of 16 July 2007)

Needs in the shelter sector remain particularly acute. An increase of diarrhea, skin and eye diseases is being reported. As of 16 July, USD 6.2 million of foreign assistance has been pledged.

SITUATION

- 280 dead, 186 missing, 367,394 homeless, 2.5 million people affected and 28 districts affected
- 3 geographical priority regions identified according to needs basis in Sindh and Balochistan
- Food, potable water and essential medicines continue to be priority needs
- In Balochistan, water receding in lower plains of Jaffarabad, Jhal Magsi and Naseerabad districts; Relief work picking up
- In Sindh, floodwaters receding in Kambar district where >1,200 villages affected and 132,400 persons displaced
- 10,000 people reportedly returned to their villages; 5,100 still remain in spontaneous camps on roadside
- In Dadu, 175 villages submerged in floodwater, affecting 85,000 persons
- As more information on humanitarian situation becomes available, aid organizations revising their estimates upwards

ACTION

- Concerning food and potable water, assistance focusing on Dadu and Kambar Shadadkot (Sindh), and on Jhal Magsi, Jaffarabad, Naseerabad, Kharan and Turbat districts (Balochistan)
- 30,000 tents sent to priority districts
- Government and its national and international partners set up 230 medical camps and 67 mobile teams
- PRCS / IFRC shipped 3,000 food parcels and will carry out its WATSAN programme in Kech, covering pop. of 5,000
